#### OUR NEW BOOK:

## "GENEALOGICAL REGISTER OF EDMUND RICE DESCENDANTS"

The publication of a companion book to A. H. Ward's "Rice Family" 1858, was conceived some thirty years ago. Since that time, there has been much faithful anticipation and hard dedicated work for its fulfillment by many members of our Association. Now, the Managing Editor of "The Genealogical Register of Edmund Rice Descendants", 1970, announces that the book will be delivered before the Summer is over.

Word was received, 2 June, 1970, that the plates were made for the 1,608 pages and proof sheets have been run off. All details have been agreed upon. Production Section Chief, Roland A. Mulhauser, promises delivery the first week in September.

The book will be a fraction of an inch larger than the reprint of Ward's "Rice Family", but it will be twice as thick. The binding will be red, matching the color of the reprint. It will have 260 pages of Index with 65,000 name-entries. The type size and general appearance will be much like the index in The New England Historical and Genealogical Society Register. An added feature will be four pictures of interest and a photo-copy of Edmund Rice's signature.

All in all, this proposes to be a well organized, handsome and very legible type with beautiful binding. It is a book any descendant of Edmund Rice will cherish as a memorial. For genealogical researchers, it will prove a valuable asset not only for Rices, but also for many New England families.

The price of the book will be \$25.00 per copy after September first 1970. For all who have made advance payments and for all orders received from members by August 31st., with checks included, the price will be \$20.00 per copy. This gives the members of our Association an opportunity to get this very valuable book at a minimum cost.
