## THE 1970 ANNUAL MEETING

This year's meeting was held in the United Methodist Church buildings, Sudbury, Mass., where we met in 1965. It is not far from the cemetery nor from Wayland Center. There was ample space in the big hall for the meeting, as well as for serving the dinner to over fifty members and guests, with plenty of parking space too. It was nice to be in the open spaces where the good Deacon tread his meadows or rode his horse.

Vice President Vincent F. Rice is to be commended for the fine job of making the arrangements for this meeting. The luncheon was good and nicely served and the entertainment was exceptionally good. Special mention goes to Miss Margaret S. Rice, a Director, for the attractive program. Reproduced on the cover is a pen and ink drawing, by Pauline Attlee, of the Deacon Edmund Rice homestead located near the Old Spring. The first part of the house was built by Thomas Axtell. Deacon Rice and his sons as well as a grandson added to the structures of the old house in later years.

Shortly after 2:00 P.M., most of those present joined a 'procession' to "God's Acres", the North Graveyard, Sudbury Road, Wayland, Mass., for a ceremony at the Edmund Rice grave. Here, President Rice, gave a brief address on the character of the worthy Deacon and his influence on his fellow men, and then expressed the need for the practice of those very principles today. He concluded by placing a beautiful wreath at the base of the large, bluestone tombstone. The Rev. Col. E. J. Graebner spoke a few appropriate words and closed with an invocation and blessing. The inspired and friendly "Cousins" took leave, one from an other, and departed with, "We'll see you all next September."

It is hoped that we may get some good pictures of the Services for our files, from the two photographers who were there. For you members who could not be present, we must tell you that the day was a heart-warming experience for all.

Thomas R. Silverberg, a vocalist student, provided a fine musical program. He captivated his audience with his lovely voice and easy manner. Miss Mary Jane McMullen ably accompanied him on the piano. Mr. Silverberg, a young man yet in his teens, has exceptional talent. He and his three brothers, Eric John, Arthur Arvo and Lawrence Lars, are Rice descendants. They are the sons of our Secretary, Constance Campbell and grandsons of Vincent F. Rice.

It was encouraging for the Rice Association to see so many fine young Rice people there. Others attending the Meeting were Linda Ward and her sister, Mrs. Marilyn Schnittkind, also, the two daughters and son of Attorney and Mrs. R. Rand Haven, Jr. and John E. Vivian, who is a recent graduate of M.I.T., and has held office in our Association as Assistant Treasurer. Yes, also add to this list June M. Estabrook and William Canfield.

BOOKS

As to be expected, the interest at the meeting was strong in the new books and aroused a new fervor in tracing ancestry.

A sample copy of the new book, "A Genealogical Register of Edmund Rice Descendants" arrived in Cambridge on July 25, for the approval of the Managing Editor. An approval and the final payment was immediately returned and a few days later the shipment was made by water to New York. By the 8th of September, they were delivered to Stanley Rice in Worcester. The miracle had really happened; the books, after many years of labor and hope, were here for the 1970 Reunion Meeting. As Mr. Rice said, "It doesn't seem real."

It is a 1608-page book, printed on bible paper, beautifully bound between red cloth-covered boards, matching that of Ward's "Rice Family" reprint. The index is a wonder; thanks to Mr. and Mrs. Stanley Rice. The books are encased in nice hard-board boxes ready for shipping.

In August, a manuscript index, compiled several years ago by Frederick R. Rice, was printed. It consists of Rice names not found in the index to A. H. Ward's "Rice Family" of 1858. After editing this list, your Managing Editor had it printed by photo-offset and then assembled and staple-bound it into 32-page booklets,  $5\frac{1}{2} \times 8\frac{1}{2}$  inches. Only 100 copies were made. It contains 1,350 names, two columns to the page, and gives the married names of some of the Rice women not known to Mr. Ward. Another aid to Rice searchers; these booklets may be obtained by ordering them through the Secretary, at \$1.25 each.

Through the efforts of your Managing Editor, the Edmund Rice (1638) Association, Inc., has, since 1966, considerably extended the publication of Rice genealogical records from that of Andrew H. Ward's book of 1858.

In 1967; the "Supplement to Mr. Ward's 1858 book, the 110-page text compiled by Mr. & Mrs. Frederick R. Rice, was published.

In 1970, the biggest and by far the largest undertaking; "A Genealogical Register of Edmund Rice Descendants", was realized. This is a book of 1,608 pages with a 260-page index, and contains eleven generations. It was compiled chiefly from the descent records of members by Elsie Hawes Smith and Mr. & Mrs. Frederick R. Rice, assisted by Mr. & Mrs. Stanley I. Rice.

In 1970; the third publication was done for the Association. It is an "Index to Rice Names" not found in the index to Ward's "Rice Family".

The Association has now published most of the known descendants of Deacon Edmund Rice, 1595-1663. The twelfth and thirteenth generations are typed ready for printing, but were not included in the new book because of the limit put on the size of the book. Unfortunately for others, like the Vivian and Ellis lines, the descent records were somehow inadvertently not included in the manuscript. Mrs. Florence (Frye) Vivian's descent is printed in this News Letter (October 1970). Others who have met a similar fate, may have their "Record of Descent" published in a News Letter of the "Edmund Rice (1638) Association, Inc.
