If you are lucky enough to travel this year with the gas situation the way it is, it might be of interest for you to know what is on display in a small library in western Massachusetts, namely the Becket Athenaeum, Becket, Massachusetts on Route 8. The summer hours are Tuesday and Thursday 1 to 4 P.M., Wednesday evening 6 to 8 P.M. and Saturday 9 A.M. to 1.

When Becket had their Bicentennial in 1965, Donna Rice McGovern (page 1067 in Rice Register) was chosen the Becket Bicentennial Queen. A local resident Col. (ret.) Albert M. Jackson did a lovely oil painting of her at that time. The painting is now on display in the Athenaeum.

Wedding Congratulations

Wedding congratulations are in order for two of our members, C. Whiting Rice, Jr. and Larisa Dzinstra Lemkins. They were married 13 October 1973 at the Jamaica Plain Lutheran Church, Jamaica Plain, Massachusetts. He is the son of our 1st vice president Charles Rice and his wife Harriett of Wrentham, Massachusetts.

Peter Rice Homestead, Marlboro, Mass.

Did you ever get in on the ground floor of a restoration project? Well, Stanley I. Rice, one of our Directors of the Edmund Rice (1638) Association, and his wife, Tene, were called some time ago by Mr. and Mrs. A. Sidney Brigham of the Marlboro Historical Society, to see if they could help on information on the home and family of Peter Rice, a third generation descendant of Edmund Rice.

The Honeywell Corporation, with a factory nearby, had bought the land on which the fine old home of Peter Rice stood, and, like a good corporate citizen, had, five years ago, given the house to the Marlboro Historical Society. In recent years the house had been converted into a four-apartment dwelling, but Mr. Brigham, also a Rice Descendant, interested in antiques and restoration, saw possibilities of saving this historic landmark. The house had had additions made over the years to make room for the large families of succeeding generations, especially that of Otis Russell and his wife, Levinah Rice, who had seventeen children. This family was the last of the Rice line to live in the house. Beside the farming activities, shoes were also made in the house workshops, a common activity in many of the old Marlboro homes.

As walls and plaster, modern flooring and partitions, are removed in the course of the restoration, exciting discoveries of original paneling and wide floor boards, fireplaces and colonial ovens are made, indicating that it is quite possible that this is one of the few really old houses left in Marlboro and that the date of 1688 on the big center chimney may be accurate.

In the four years since restoration of the home was initiated under the auspices of the Marlboro Historical Society, members of that group have held bake sales on the first Saturday of each month. A tea room with blue checkered tablecloths, serving ladies in colonial costume, strawberry festivals in June and quilting bees, all aid in raising funds for the restoration.

The Society hopes to foster an interest in local history by introducing young children (and in many instances, their parents,) to the homestead and the way of life known to the Rice Family living their in the 18th and early 19th centuries. Their program has been very well received.

Mrs. Brigham says that there is much work still to be done in researching the house and the family that lived there for five generations, and the Marlboro Historical Society would appreciate hearing from any who may have information — letters, diaries, reminiscences, etc. — regarding the Rice Family in Marlboro. Household artifacts also are needed, especially those which may have been used by Rices, — pewter plates or tankards, fireplace cooking implements, andirons and tongs, early furniture and pottery. It would also be nice to know

the history of any article which might be donated. If members of the Rice Association are so inclined, they may write to:

It is refreshing to meet members of a dedicated group such as this who have enthusiasm and interest in what they are trying to accomplish — surely a project which all Rices would like to see most successful. If you have a chance to visit, the Peter Rice Homestead is on Elm Street in Marlboro and the Society invites Members of the Edmund Rice (1638) Association, individually or as a group, to enjoy this family homestead. It is possible that an annual reunion may be held there sometime.

The book, "The Merrimac River and its Tributaries" gives the name of D. H. Rice as the Agent of The Merrimac Hosiery Co. at Bristol, N.H. in 1869. Does anyone know who he was? Would like to know his parents' names and where he was born.

Belknap's "Artists and Craftsmen of Essex County" says "Luther G. Rice was a watchmaker in Lowell in 1833 when he worked for Hazen Elliot on Merrimac Street. He was not in Lowell in 1834." Can anyone tell us if this was the same Luther G. Rice given in Ward as #3498, son of Elijah Rice and Martha Goddard, married Elizabeth Colburn of Dracut?
