Mrs. Grace Rice Edstrom of Auburn, Massachusetts has this information to pass along to us. Did you know that some of the graves that were dug up on the Worcester, Massachusetts Common are buried in Hope Cemetery, Worcester, Massachusetts?

There is a large monument that is engraved with this epitaph. "The remains of 111 persons who were buried on Worcester Common and removed to this place during the construction of Worcester Center in 1968.

47 listed below are interred with their gravestones laid flat above them. The remainder without gravestones are unidentified."

Mrs. Edstroms' ancestor, Gershom Rice, 2nd settler of Worcester 1768 is buried there.

If you are in Worcester and would care to see this monument, follow Main Street south to Webster Square; then take Webster Street which runs parallel with Main Street on the left, to Hope Cemetery on the left. Take the second entrance and just inside the gate turn right. At the end of this street you will see the large monument.
