 We do receive some very perplexing problems to unravel from time to time. Our historian, genealogist, Margaret S. Rice tries her best as well as other interested people to see what they can do.

One such letter came from Hollis R. Johnson, 126 Hampton Court, Bloomington, Ind.. Hollis is married, father of six children, and Professor of Astronomy at Indiana University. While doing some research in the Genealogy Section of the Indiana State Library, he came across an old copy of a news letter # 4, March 1962. Wondering if the society was still alive and well, he wrote - guess what - he found us !!

He states his connection with the Rice family as follows. My father's father's mother's mother's mother was Mary Louisa Parker, a descendant of the early Parker family of New Haven and Wallingford, Connecticut. Her father's father's mother's mother was Mary Royce, who was the daughter of Jonathan Royce, who was the son of Robert Royce (or Rice), who is said to be the brother (twin?) to Edmund Rice (1638).

Some interesting news from Mrs. Anne Rice Jacobson, 722 Alconquin Ave., Saranac Lake, N.Y.. She is a descendant of Edmund Rice in all probability and Seaver Rice knew her family sixty years ago. She has yet to pin-point her relation to Edmund Rice and Seaver has offered to help her.

Her father was Fred W. Rice, a boat builder, Anne is the

youngest of a large family.

William Marsh Rice who founded the Rice Institute, now Rice University in Houston, Texas was her father's uncle. Anne's father was the missing heir who had to be found before Uncle Wills' estate could be settled after he was murdered in N.Y. by his valet and lawyer, who had forged a will in their own favor (about 1905).

She tells us she used to correspond with some of her Houston Colonel cousins but they are all gone now, at least the ones she knew. Cousin Will said his sister, a Mrs. Loomis was a Colonial Dame and had all the family history but she never wrote to her.

The above letter brings to mind a letter your news letter editor received from a pen pal she has written to for almost 30 years. Her name is Mrs. Ann Rice Baker now of Effingham, Ill. formerly of De Leon, Texas.

Ann Rice Baker saw your editor's name in a girls magazine years ago and wondered if we were related. Well, it developed into a lasting friendship but we never could make any definite connection - just maybe someday it will go back to Deacon Edmund.

The following is a copy of a letter Ann Rice Baker's dad

James (Russell Rice) wrote to her before he died 11 June 1967: " We know very little about your great grandfather Rice. The first we know of him, he was in La. where he married a French girl by the name of Montaque. He was a medical doctor and traveled horseback with his saddle bags. From there he went to Arkansas where your grandfather - David Alexander Rice - was born. From there they went to Kentucky where my father was reared on a tobacco farm. There were seven boys in this family (John, Will, Phil, David, Joe, Sam,) I don't know the name of the other one. My dad (David) migrated with some of his brothers to Kansas in the 1870's. My dad made his first trip to Texas in 1872 where he helped build a courthouse in Gainesville, Texas and then returned to Kansas and Mo.. He did construction work on some of the biggest railroads of those states when railroads were just beginning to be built - at one time, he worked with a wagon train hauling supplies to Ft. Dodd, Kansas - army camp.

He met and married mother (Agnes Mae Wood) in 1887 in Kansas. They moved to Texas in 1893 and started operating a sandstone quarry at Proctor, Texas. In about 1900, Joe Rice died in Okla. City and we lost all contact with any of our re-

latives.

We have heard that during the 16th century three Rice brothers came to this country from Scotland and settled in North or South Carolina and the entire clan started there ????

Daddy (David) was a 2nd or 3rd cousin of William Marsh Rice who built and endowed for years to come what was Rice Institute but is now Rice University. He also built the Rice Hotel of Houston for whom it is named."

COMPOSER - EDWARD EVERETT RICE

Robert Royce, an association member from West Haven, Conn., has been currently doing some research on a person that the family may indeed be proud of; the composer Edward Everett Rice, b. 1848, a monumental figure in the history of American popular music and the inventor of the musical comedy. His first production was Evangeline (a good-humored travesty of Longfellow's poem) in 1874. It ran on and off for twenty years - a smash hit - and was the first American musical; the granddaddy of the Broadway musical, of which Rice later produced a considerable number. Up to 1874 only one musical show had ever reached the U. S. and that was The Black Crook, an English production. It was while attending this show and later Lydia Thompson's British Blondes, a rather artless group of high kicking young ladies in Tights! , that Rice got the idea that he and J. Cheever Goodwin could write a truly American musical. The English humor was just too heavy for American taste. Considering Rice's qualifications as a composer, he had no musical education whatsoever and could not even read music, he had a colossal amount of nerve backed by an equal degree of raw talent and business acumen. The young men had no money, Goodwin was a Harvard graduate working as a reporter, Rice was employed by the Cunard Steamship Lines as a clerk, and the first production was an economy minded affair to be sure. Later productions were more lavish as the money rolled in. Rice wrote the music to only two more shows Hiawatha and Adonis. His method of composition was to "dictate" the music to someone from the piano, which he played by ear, and to give suggestions as to orchestration. The quality of the music is high. He continued on as an important producer and funded the first black Broadway Musical, Clorindy, the Birth of the Cakewalk, by Will Marion Cook. Ed Rice (as he was known) has not come into general notice only because show music has not been taken seriously in the past. Rice is without doubt a king-pin figure in the history of American music. Rice is 8th in descent from Edmund. His birth will be found
