IN MEMORIAM: It is with profound sorrow that we report the loss, by death, of the following member:

Mr. Henry Eugene Rice died at his home in Nowwood, Mass. on January 2, 1963, in his 94th year. Mr. Rice was one of the original organizers of the Rice Association and attended the first meeting held August 30, 1912 at the First Parish Church in Wayland, Mass. He was President of the Association in 1921 and 1922 and at the time of his death was our oldest past-president in years and service. Mr Rice was one of the most faithful attendants at reunions and we always counted on greating him. During his term of office there is a notation that one reunion was a basket lunch on the grounds of the old Rice Homestead.

Mrs. George Franklin Smith (Elsie Hawes Smith) died on Wednesday, January 30, 1963, at the Nary Lane Hospital in Ware, Mass. Burial in Barre, Mass.

Mrs. Smith attended her first Rice Reunion in 1933 and from that time on was one of the Association's most active workers. In 1935 and 1936 she was Vice-President and elected President in 1937, with re-elections in 1938 and 1939.

In 1940 she became our Historian and served continuously until her death. She was vitally interested in history and genealogy. Her name will be remembered for ages for while historian she wrote two books 'Edmund Rice and His Family" also More About Those Rices". In addition she wrote many articles on Barre and the Rices

The Barre Gazette, in its issue of January 31st, had the following editorial comment. "Elsie Smith - A frequent contributor to our columns, a close and friendly neighbor, Elsie Smith's passing is deeply felt in our shop as well as the rest of the town where she exerted a restrained but potent influence for a long time. Writing was her hobby. History and Genealogy were the areas in which she excelled. She wrote voluminously, interestingly and devotedly about Barre and the Rice 11y. A crisp personality, she betrayed a well concealed tenderness in all dealings concerning her ancestors or her grandchildren. A women of brillance in the New England tradition of Abigail Adams, the like of Elsie Smith occurs but seldom in any sphere and we shall miss her."

We who have worked with Mrs. Smith, know that for years she urged members to file their lineages with her. Four years ago she was instrumental, with the then President, Stanley I. Rice, in getting the Association to vote to issue a supplement to Andrew Ward's book on the Rice Family. Since then she gave unstintedly of her time and amassed a vast amount of material that will be used. She has been a great inspiration to us all:

Miss Edith Allen Rice of Milford died in January, 1986. She was a sister of the late Hattie Louise Rice who died just a year ago. They used to attend reunions in the early dates and had always shown a deep interest in the Rice Family

Harold R.Rice died at his home in Springfield, Mass. on February 8, 1963 in his 77th year. Mr. Rice had been a member for several years but due to poor health had been unable to attend our reunions. He was a brother of your president.

RICE GENEALOGY One of the pressing questions asked by members is, "When will the new Rice Genealogy be out?" Our only answer is to point out some of the problems involved. All the material that Mrs. Smith had received she listed for the other two members of the Committee. She then maintained her file by generations.

Your President, as a member of the Committee, made a card for each head of a family and filed it in alphabetical order. In addition he received many many lineages that had not yet reached Mrs. Smith. We now have Mrs. Smith's file and it becomes a matter of reconcil ing the material. Often lineages covering the same persons contained conflicting information, additional children, marriages and dates. Some sent in a single lineage and when a full family record was received we found a child that was thought to be number one was later in the list of children and meant the renumbering of numerious cards. Our progress is slow even though we work long hours each day. After that there is the question of listing for theprinter as well as a complete index. We can only report that we are working hard - making progress - and ask your indulgence over conditions we cannot help.

NOW! After mentioning the amount of work ahead we draw another breath and urge ALL Descendants to send in their material for our records - and what is just as important - keep us advised of all changes such as births, marriages and deaths. FOR THE PRESENT SEND ALL MATERIAL TO THE PRESIDENT, who is also serving as Historian, Genealogist, News Editor etc.

With the west amount of material at hand we are not sure just what can be covered in this next book until it is nearer completion. However, it is our ambition to have and maintain the most complete record on Rice's in existence. It will be available to all Deason Edmund's descendants.

ANNUAL We are happy to report the largest membership that the Association has had DUES for years. However, there are still some who need reminding that their 1963 dues have not been received. Please do not put this off! Any surplus over expenses will aid the book fund - when needed.

Many members have sent in the names of persons who might be interested in joining the Rice Association. To these friends we have sent copies of the current News Letters in hopes that they might become interested in our project. We cannot continue sending the News Letters indefinitely to non-members.
