INCORPORATION At the past annual reunion the membership voted to take the neccessary steps to place the incorporation papers in good standing with the State of Massachusetts. Vice-President Ray I. Ellis checked with the Secretary of State on what would be required. All requirements have now been met and we can again legally use our full title, "Edmund Rice (1638) Association. Inc.

FISCAL YEAR

This is just a reminder that the annual meeting closes our fiscal year and that the dues (\$2.00) will again be acceptable. The Treasurer tells us she has plenty of membership cards and is just awaiting your check. YOUR DUES are what are needed to keep the Association healthy. Your officers are frugal and in many cases use their own funds. There are no salaries paid to anyone. Surplus over postage and supplies will be used for the new book. Many thanks to those who have included extra dollars in their checks or enrolled other members of the family.

Letters are constantly being received by your Editor submitting addi-RICE tional lineages or seeking information on a Rice ancestor. We are GENEALOGY very happy to see that notice of our project is spreading throughout the country and that additional descendants are seeking to have their lines on record with the Edmund Rice (1638) Association. Please include return postage with all requests for information.

Until such time as the Association can see its way clear to printing the new genealogy, your Editor has taken the position that the book should not be issued until we are satisfied that the majority of Rice Descendants have had the opportunity of placing their lineages on record. We are still getting lineages covering children listed in Ward's book. Andrew Ward listed 6276 names and in some instances nothing beyond a child's name. We are happy to report that lineages received cover more than 1,000 of those listed by Ward. In addition our records cover additional children that Ward was not aware of. To bring all these persons up to date runs into a fantastic number of descendants and presents a quandary that the Association has yet to solve.

Stanley I. Rice of the Publication Committee states that the response to our suggestion that members send in an advance order for the book, together with \$15.00, has not been what was hoped. Only three dozen orders with cash have been received. The last News Letter carried our financial statement and it is obvious that at the moment there are not sufficient funds to print a book.

From time to time this News Letter has carried the mild suggestion that it would be appreciated if members would donate money for printing. As of this date the amount sent in would not purchase a \$100.00 plate at a political dinner. A \$10,000 to \$15,000 revolving fund would go far towards making it possible to print one or more volumes that will be compiled. Donor's names will be inscribed in the finished books for all to know who helped spousor them. Your Committee has worked hard for a number of years to assemble the records perpetuating the name of RICE. Send your remittances (in any amount) to Stanley I. We would then issue the printed book starting where the supplement left off. This plan would eliminate repeating or using space in the new book that could be used for additional descendants.

The Rice Association was formed by persons residing mostly in Massachusetts. It then spread to the other New England States and New York. The publicity about a new genealogy spread the word and we now have members from all parts of the nation.

RECORDS

Thanks go to the members who have been sending in census, vital and cemetery records. The thought occurs that if the Association decides to carry out the plan for a printed supplement that the space could be used in the News Letters for such records. A number of members have written expressing the desire to be of help - they can if they copy records or send clippings where the name RICE is mentioned. Send them to your Editor until such time as a new Historian is names. We maintain a scrap-book.

RICE'S OF VIRGINIA Thomas Rice was an early immigrant of Virginia. We do not know the name of his wife, but they had nine sons and three daughters. The names of the sons were: Hezekiah, Benjamin, David, Nathan, Micajah, James, Matthew, Thomas and William. The names of the daughters were not included in the records sent us.

It is said that this Thomas Rice or Rhys was of Welsh and Norman extraction claiming descent from William the Conqueror. Perhaps this is the reason for the conflicting claims that Deacon Edmund Rice was of royal blood. To the best of our knowledge there is no conclusive proof shouwing Edmund's parentage.

OTHER RICE'S

Our "no record" file contains Rice names from New York, Conn. Maine and Ohio, in addition to many from the South. Time does not permit the research necessary to identify many of those so classified. The News Letters in the past have carried requests for information on unknowns, but to-date no one has ever come up with an answer. Here are some more!
