Arthur C. Hoefler, while Mr. and Mrs. Wilfred E. Rice came from Miami, Florida to attend their first Reunion. Others came from Michigan, Ohio, Tenn. and seven from New Jersey. New York and the New England States had the largest representation.

Past President Edgar W. Rice was selected as Committee Chairman for the arrangements for next year's reunion. Announcement of their plans will be made in the next News Letter.

Theo L. and Josephine S. Rice were unable to attend this year's reunion being away on a cruise celebrating their 40th wedding anniversary.

This year's printed program was compiled by Vice President Ray L. Ellis.
