President's Column

Greetings, cousins!

First, let me say what a pleasure it was to see many of you at the latest reunion. As always, there was a mix of familiar faces from previous reunions and new faces of first-time attendees. Topics of discussion ranged from current events, such as the hurricane that passed us that week, to features of by-gone days, such as Colonial firefighters. Read on in this issue for more details.

In the past, I have written of the Association's genealogical database as a multipurpose resource. However, it has its limits. I recently had occasion to ponder Andrew Henshaw Ward, the compiler of *_The Rice Family_*, and I thought surely he must be a descendant of Edmund Rice and would therefore be in our database. Guess what? He isn't a descendant, but he's in the database anyhow, basically because of his role as a genealogist.

The question that occurred to me was: how close is Ward to belonging in the database on the strength of his genes, as opposed to his diligence? Bear in mind that we include the parents of descendants' spouses, and sometimes even

the grandparents (in cases where parents of spouses happen to be siblings of other parents of spouses or siblings of other spouses). Poking into Ward's ancestry, I found that his paternal great grandparents, Nahum and Martha (Howe) Ward, are present in the database because their daughter Persis married Bezaleel Eager, a Rice descendant. Indeed, this marriage is one of the many links between the Ward and Rice families mentioned in my first *_Family Thicket_*. Needless to say, Nahum's grandfather William Ward, the immigrant Ward ancestor, is also in the database. Incidentally, Nahum's father is included as well, since both Nahum and his brother William were parents of Rice spouses. Looking further, I found that AHW's mother, Elizabeth Denny, has a brother in the database, the father of Mary Denny, who married Rice descendant Aaron Morse. Moreover, it turns out that AHW's sister Elizabeth also married into the database, and so their parents are included, too. That means AHW's entire paternal lineage back to the immigrant is included in our database for one reason or another, with the sole exception of his grandfather, General Artemas Ward.

Of course, none of this requires the inclusion of AHW himself. We know from the Shrewsbury vital records that he had nine children, but some died young, and the others evidently moved away from Shrewsbury before settling down, as the town's records do not show any marriages of his children or births of grandchildren before 1850. I was able to track down two of his sons, but their wives seem not to be Rice descendants. The search could be extended to his grandchildren, but I left that for another time.

Membership

QUERIES:

1) I have been researching my family tree back to Edmund Rice. My father Charles James Rice passed away last week and I believe from what I traced back that he was a direct male descendant of Edmund Rice. From what I can see on my family tree where it extends from the Edmund Rice database is the following. I didn't show all the children but just the direct descendants, however, I can provide a complete list.

Elijah Rice (1719-1785) married Sarah Shattuck (1720-1761) a son Daniel Rice (1745-1821)

Daniel Rice (1745-1821) married Sarah Childs (1746-1818) a son Elisha Rice (1779-1849)

Elisha Rice (1779-1849) married Patty Wood (1780-1856) a son Moses Rice (1815-1870)

Moses Rice (1815-1870) married Fanny P. Holland (1819-1887) where they moved from New Hampshire to upstate New York in the St. Lawrence and Fulton areas. They has a son James Rice (1842-1888)

Some caution is necessary in this kind of endeavor, since there were unrelated Rices in Connecticut who also spread out to the north and west and mingled with Edmund Rice's descendants particularly in Vermont and upstate New York. However, Rice's who turn up there are not necessarily from the Massachusetts line.

Yes, Elisha and Patty had a son Moses, but he was born in 1816 and died in 1839. This information comes to us from the compilation by Andrew H. Ward, who was a contemporary. Ward was not infallible, but I think we can rely upon him for the events that occurred while he was compiling the genealogy. I would say that you need to do a bit more digging to figure out where your Moses Rice (1815-1870) came from.

Have you looked for him in the 1840 census? His whereabouts at that time could be a very important clue to his birthplace and parentage.

It is still quite possible that he was a direct descendant of Edmund, but that remains an open question. If you want to pin down that question while you continue to work on the paper trail, it is possible to ascertain the male-line ancestry by getting a male Rice member of your family to take a simple DNA test. A brother would be ideal.

It appears that your lineage after Moses is solid, and so the main question at this point is the origin of Moses. I have looked through our database for a Moses born in 1815, but I didn't find one. I am cc'ing this reply to our organization's historian. If you like, I can also send your message to our newsletter editor for publication in the query section of the fall issue.

2) Do you have record of the Burlingame descendants of Edmund Rice through Christopher Burlingame & Susanna Putnam, daughter of Rufus Putnam and Persis Rice, daughter of Zebulon Rice of Westborough, MA?

I am doing some interesting historical research in Illinois, and have come across Rufus Putnam Burlingame and his siblings who came to Illinois in the 1830's from Marietta, Ohio and environs. They are a very interesting and adventuresome bunch, who contributed a great deal to the development of the frontier. If their Rice connection can be documented satisfactorily, and I believe that it can, they will be an interesting addition to the Rice family history.

Interestingly enough, I'm also Rice descendent. I always wondered how/why some of my ancestors reached Ohio so early, and might have found the connection with Rufus Putnam and his Ohio Company. He encouraged Revolutionary War Veterans, among them Christopher Burlingame and apparently some of my relatives, to come West. Extended family ties were extremely strong on the frontier, as study of the Putnam/Burlingame family demonstrates.
