# **President's Column**

#### Greetings, cousins!

I guess everyone knows by now that the US Bureau of the Census released the 1940 census at the beginning of April, and, not only that, but released the census in the form of digitized images that could be (and were) immediately placed on line for the public to study. Simultaneously, at least two organizations (and possibly others) launched projects to index the entire release. I thought of volunteering to help with the indexing, but the fact is I'm too busy already.

In any case, it is possible to look up some people even without an index, simply by knowing where they lived at that time, and I couldn't resist the temptation to do that. I started by looking for my father, who was then a brand-new PhD chemist working for the DuPont Company and living in a small town in southern Delaware -- small enough that there were only two enumeration districts. I was lucky enough to find him in the first district. There he was, boarding in a residential home along with two other boarders, also young professionals. The listing showed his correct name, age, and place of birth, and the fact that he had been living in another state five years earlier, but there was a slight inaccuracy in the education column, which showed him

with only "C4" meaning 4 years of college. I kept on scanning and soon found the woman he married later that same year (who unfortunately died a year later in childbirth).

I proceeded to look up my mother, who was then living at home in a small town in Pennsylvania. Success again, and I found that the listing was entirely accurate in her case, even to the fine point of having lived in the same town, but in a different house, five years earlier.

My next foray was a bit more challenging: to look for my paternal grandparents, who lived in a not-so-small town in Massachusetts, where, in fact, I later lived myself. The street where they lived was one block long and extended between two major thoroughfares that were both chosen as boundaries of enumeration districts. As it happened, that street was not included in either of the two districts that covered the similar one-block streets adjacent to it, and so I had to read through four whole districts before I found it tacked on as an afterthought to a non-contiguous district. Then, after all that searching, I discovered that their house was not listed anyhow!

That brief encounter sums up the census experience as a whole -- lots of useful information, some inaccuracies, and some gaps in coverage.

# More Books... by our cousins

**Frederic A. Wallace**, Framingham's Town Historian, is the author of "**Ancestors and Descendants of the Rice Brothers of Springfield, Mass.**: David Rice, William Marsh Rice, Caleb Hall Rice, Frederick Allyn Rice, Seven Generations – 1704 to 2004". This is a serious genealogy and history of the family descended from David Rice, who first appeared in the records of Milton and Weymouth, Mass., around 1725. Special attention is given to four brothers, born in Springfield, Mass., who went to Texas in the early to mid-1800's to seek their fortunes. One, William Marsh Rice, became the founder of Rice University in Houston. Their story is a classic example of a family torn apart by the Civil War. DNA evidence, obtained through the ERA's Rice Family DNA Project, is presented to resolve longstanding questions about the origins of this line. Mildred L. Henschel is the author of Lickiss Families and English Ancestors consists of 292 pages and is spiral-bound with laminated covers. It consists of 3 parts: the first is English Ancestors, which includes Rice, Towne, Ball, Boland, Bullard, Mellen, Southworth, Whale, French, Fox, Frost, Moore, and Hancock. The second part starts with Hancock-- Sarah Jane who married the first John Lickiss to come to America and their descendants. The 3rd part consists of other Lickiss families, and includes a Table of Contents and Index. Price is \$45, postage and handling included.
