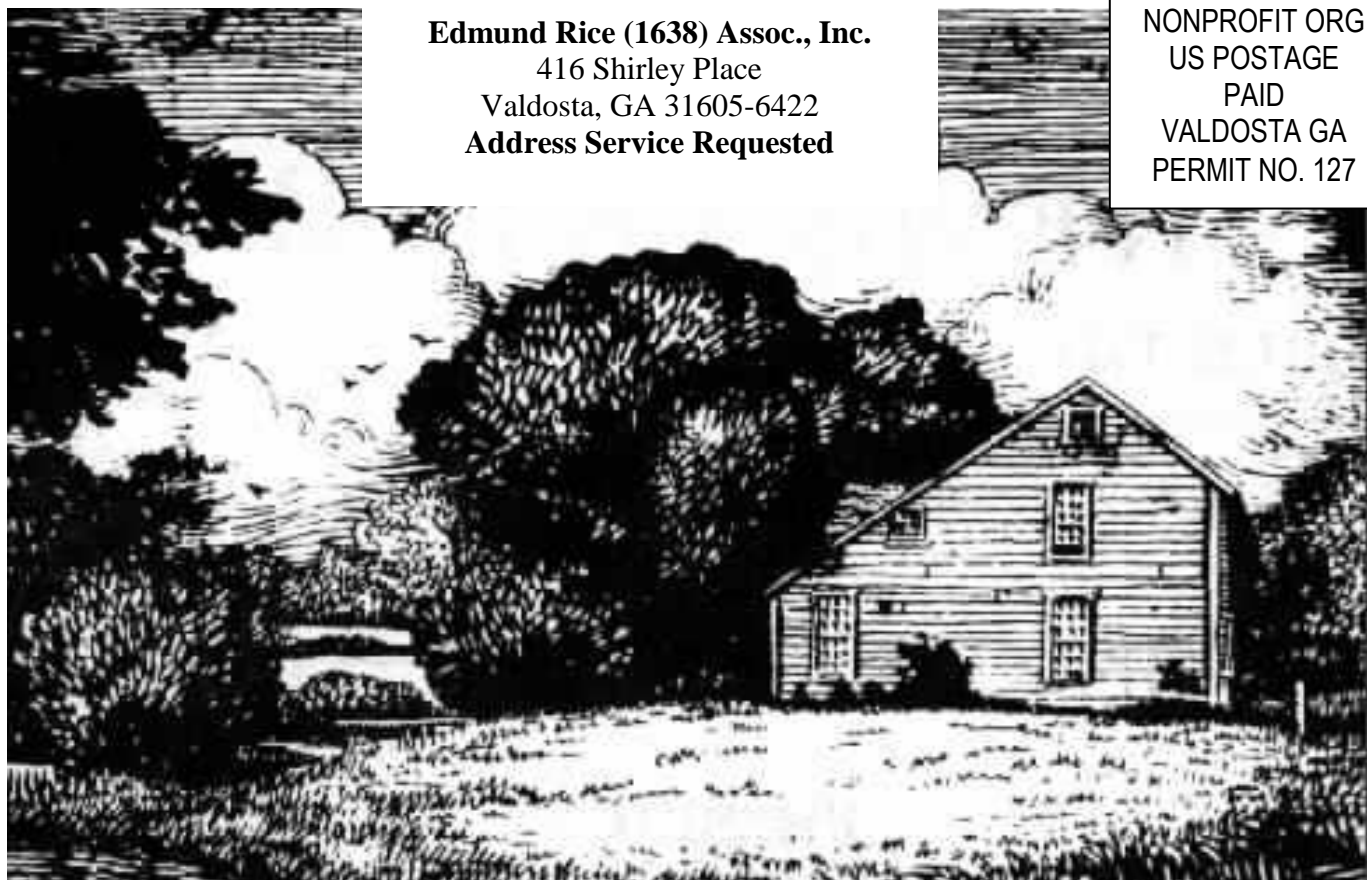

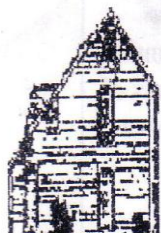

President's Column

Greetings, cousins!

Joyful news: I have just returned from my nephew's wedding. Diligent genealogist that I am, entering the relevant data in my files was the second thing I did after turning on my computer (the first was, of course, checking my email). Then again, when I say "relevant data", I have to admit that I have not yet obtained the birth information for the new bride. I will make a point of getting that in due course.

In any case, this is an example of what we might call "continuing" or "maintenance" genealogy. Unlike the boom/bust pattern of research genealogy, where we can (and hopefully do) make breakthroughs that suddenly reveal whole new family branches, this style requires and relies on patient and continual record collection, and branches of the family are "revealed" one person at a time, as they are added (or two, in the case of twins). You might think that this style of genealogy lacks excitement, but, after all, weddings are a lot of fun! Wouldn't it be fantastic if the job of ERA Historian were to attend (and record) the weddings of all descendants of Edmund Rice?? Of course, that would require the appointment of a veritable army of Deputy Historians, since I would guess there are on the order of 100,000 such weddings per year. Needless to say, I'm not seriously proposing such a scheme, but the fact is that patient and continual record collection is much more effective than the type of "catch-up" genealogy we have to do if we wait until centuries after the events of interest.

This is the reason why, even though we scrupulously guard the privacy of living persons entered in the Association's genealogical database, we still ask contributors to include all information they have about any Rice descendants right down to the present day. This patient collection of private data will make the job of future Historians that much easier.

On another topic: one of the focuses of the upcoming reunion will be cemeteries, including a cemetery visit on the bus tour and a presentation by Midge Frazel about what to do and see at cemeteries. I am compiling a list of persons in the Association database who are known or believed to be buried in Marlborough cemeteries, and I will post it on the web site. Look for it on the "Library" page. Hope to see you at the reunion!

Membership

The Edmund Rice (1638) Association, Inc. is governed by a Board of Directors, of at least five members, elected at the annual reunion and meeting, usually held on a weekend in September.

Descendants of Edmund Rice were holding reunions as early as 1851, but it was not until 1912 that the Association was formed and officers elected. Incorporation under Massachusetts law took place in 1934.

Membership is open to anyone who claims to be a lineal descendant of Edmund Rice. Rigorous proof is not required and many members have been able to ascertain their pedigree only after access to the books and files of other members. Spouses are also eligible for membership.

Address Corrections:

The Post Office now forwards mail for 12 months if a member has submitted a forwarding address to the post office. The post office also returns the forwarding address to the association for a .65 fee. If a member has no forwarding address or 12 months forwarding has expired the post office returns the mail. More Books... by our cousins

Frederic A. Wallace, Framingham's Town Historian, is the author of "**Ancestors and Descendants of the Rice Brothers of Springfield, Mass.:** David Rice, William Marsh Rice, Caleb Hall Rice, Frederick Allyn Rice, Seven Generations – 1704 to 2004". This is a serious genealogy and history of the family descended from David Rice, who first appeared in the records of Milton and Weymouth, Mass., around 1725. Special attention is given to four brothers, born in Springfield, Mass., who went to Texas in the early to mid-1800's to seek their fortunes. One, William Marsh Rice, became the founder of Rice University in Houston. Their story is a classic example of a family torn apart by the Civil War. DNA evidence, obtained through the ERA's Rice Family DNA Project, is presented to resolve longstanding questions about the origins of this line. Mildred L. Henschel is the author of **Lickiss Families and English Ancestors** consists of 292 pages and is spiral-bound with laminated covers.
