President's Column

Greetings, cousins!

In the last issue, I promised to talk about finding the correct volume at Family Search for a lookup in the Massachusetts vital records when the Family Search index doesn't seem to have the desired individual. As I remarked last time, the index has curious lapses, stemming from a combination of wretched handwriting by the town clerks, unstable inks, deteriorating paper, out-of-focus microfilming, and unfamiliarity of the volunteer indexers with old-fashioned naming practices or the geography of Massachusetts. The bottom line is that some index items are not findable in searching with the correct name, even after allowing for the misspelling-tolerant lookup system.

What to do? In some cases, the researcher may already have a fairly precise idea of when and where the event took place, but Family Search is not organized to look up a particular time and place. As it happens, the browse facility for Massachusetts births and marriages offers up a list of "digital folders" where the images are stored, but the online finding aid is the FHL catalog organized by microfilm numbers. Fortunately, there is a one-to-one correspondence between folders and films, but, unfortunately, the folder and film numbers are unrelated to each other. I found myself constructing my own finding aid by downloading the film catalog and the lists of folder numbers and painstakingly mapping the two frames of reference. Of course, this finding aid is complicated by the fact that there is yet another (haphazard) mapping between film numbers and the original volume numbers of the Massachusetts vital records, as well as a (systematic) mapping between volume numbers and years and a varying mapping between volumes and counties within each year. For example, consider digital folder 4279596, which corresponds to FHL film 1433031. According to the catalog, it contains volumes 245 (p. 200 to the end), 246, and 253, covering marriages for parts of 1872 and 1873. As it happens, p. 200 is in the middle of the 1872 annual marriage report for the town of Holliston in Middlesex County, and this folder/film then proceeds alphabetically by town within each county and alphabetically by county through the rest of 1872 (except that Dukes County is grouped with Nantucket for geographic reasons). Volume 246 covers Suffolk and Worcester Counties. Volume 253 covers Barnstable through Franklin Counties for 1873. Parts of the FHL catalog specify the locations covered by the successive volumes, but not this part -- I have filled in this part by my own browsing (still a work in progress). Someday I will have this all ready for posting on the ERA web site.

Hope to see you at the reunion in Sturbridge!
