President's Column

Greetings, cousins!

My wife and I just celebrated our 40th anniversary, and I have been thinking about the strange human custom of giving special meaning to numbers with zeroes in them. Of course, in the old days, odometers were mechanical devices with interlocking wheels, so that there was some real drama when a row of nines drifted slowly out of view together, to be replaced by an incoming row of zeroes. However, this fascination with zeroes far precedes the widespread existence of odometers. For example, the year 1000 of the Common Era (often known as AD) was widely regarded as a momentous time when the world might very well end. The same thing happened more recently, in 2012, when the Mayan calendar similarly "turned over" from a row of 19's to a row of zeroes (the turnovers are even more dramatic in a vigesimal system because they happen so much less often!). What lots of people didn't realize was that the 2012 Mayan turnover was the 13th such event in the Long Count, and in fact another one is coming in the year 2407. For that matter, the starting point of the Mayan Long Count is in 3114 BC, i.e., well before the Mayans were actually keeping track of the calendar.

Personally, I can sympathize with the desire to set up a day-counting system that doesn't have to introduce any pesky minus signs, since astronomers all do the same thing with our Julian Date system, where day #1 is 4713 Jan 1 BC. Incidentally, today is JD 2457226, and the most recent "dramatic" turnover in the JD system (to 2000000) was in the year 763, and the next one won't be until 3501.

Anyway, what this discussion is leading to is that we are rapidly coming up on the 400th anniversary of Edmund Rice and Thomasine Frost. They were married in 1618. Of course, we have to take the calendar change into account when figuring their anniversary, since Parliament decreed that legal ages would not be accelerated by the adoption of the Gregorian calendar. That means their wedding date of October 15 corresponds to October 28 in this century. So mark your calendars for a big anniversary bash shortly after our 2018 ERA reunion.

Meanwhile, don't forget that the 2015 reunion is coming soon. See inside for details. Hope to see you there!

The Edmund Rice (1638) Association, Inc. is governed by a Board of Directors, of at least five members, elected at the annual reunion and meeting, usually held on a weekend in September.

Descendants of Edmund Rice were holding reunions as early as 1851, but it was not until 1912 that the Association was formed and officers elected. Incorporation under Massachusetts law took place in 1934.

Membership is open to anyone who claims to be a lineal descendant of Edmund Rice. Rigorous proof is not required and many members have been able to ascertain their pedigree only after access to the books and files of other members. Spouses are also eligible for membership.
