President's Column

Greetings, cousins!

What is a family? In the modern world of computer-aided genealogy powered by GEDCOM, the question becomes "What is a FAM?", and the answer is "a collection of one or more individuals linked together with spousal or parental relationships". Now it might seem strange to imagine a family consisting of just one person, but GEDCOM allows it. Indeed, the ERA database has had one-person families from time to time, mostly by accident, such as when a database contributed by a cousin is pruned of everyone who isn't either an Edmund Rice descendant or a descendant's spouse or a descendant's spouse's parent. It sometimes happens that a person is pruned away but leaves behind a spousal link to someone still there. The correct treatment is to remove the relationships as well as the persons, and I am glad to say that there were no one-person families in the ERA database the last time I looked. Still, the database has quite a variety of family shapes, not all consisting of the typical father, mother, and one or more children. Some consist of a father and child(ren); others of a mother and child(ren); still others of two spouses and no children. In principle, it's possible to have a family with no explicit parents, and merely collection of siblings linked together, but TMG, the program that holds the ERA database, doesn't handle families in exactly the GEDCOM way, and I believe a siblings-only family would be lost on input to TMG. (This makes sense when you think about it -- if you don't know who even one of the parents is, then the relationship between the supposed siblings is doubtful at best.)

This brings me to the topic of marriage and divorce. When the element of time is added, then the whole concept of families becomes more fluid, as relationships end in death or divorce and children may be adopted by successor step-parents. The database has numerous examples. One thing that is remarkable, however, is the overwhelming proportion of families in the database that include a marriage tag. I did a survey of the main portion of the database (the Rice descendants and their spouses/partners) and found that 97% of the family groupings had marriage tags. Given the sketchy nature of record-keeping and the difficulty of tracking down the marriage records in distant localities, it seems astonishing that such a high proportion of documentation should be reached. However, a closer look at the database shows that many of the marriage tags do not include a time or place for the event -- they are instead inferred from such things as gravestones or census records that refer to people as husbands or wives.

Descendants of Edmund Rice were holding reunions as early as 1851, but it was not until 1912 that the Association was formed and officers elected. Incorporation under Massachusetts law took place in 1934.

Membership is open to anyone who claims to be a lineal descendant of Edmund Rice. Rigorous proof is not required and many members have been able to ascertain their pedigree only after access to the books and files of other members. Spouses are also eligible for membership.
