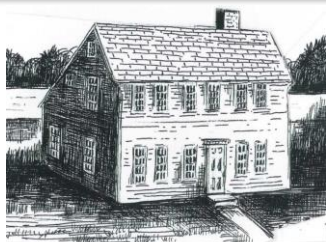

I would like to take a moment here to amplify our Editor's call for relief. This newsletter is the feature that holds the ERA together year in year out, by maintaining communication with those who are unable to attend the annual reunions. As President, I have been called upon twice (and now a third time) to fill in on short notice in the interim between editorships, and I can attest that the job is fun and relatively easy. All I needed in the way of equipment was a computer with word-processing software and access to email. So, please consider embarking on this adventure. If you have questions about the job, feel free to ask me or Katrina.

On another front, the cohesion of the ERA also depends on the growth of the family database, which ties us all together as descendants of Edmund Rice. If you have not submitted your lineage for inclusion in the database, there's no time like the present for rectifying that omission.

Then again, I must admit that submitting a lineage does not guarantee immediate inclusion in the database. I recently received two big boxes of paper records collected (and in many cases inherited) by a previous Historian, some of them being correspondence dating back to the 1970's. Many of these records are indeed included already in the database, but some are not. Some of the problems that evidently delayed action on submitted data were crucial disconnects somewhere along the line and/or outright dead ends, requiring research to tie the pieces together. For the foreseeable future, I will be interleaving research/verification for these long-deferred submissions with action on current data.

Please note that not all Rices are related to Deacon Edmund, and so some of the old correspondence may end up as invalid for ERA purposes. For a notable example, the prominent Rice family connected to Rice University has been shown by the Rice DNA project to be unrelated to us, even though they can trace back to Colonial Massachusetts.

All that being said, if you believe or hope that your family line is included in the database and would like to know for sure, feel free to send me a note. I will be happy to check for you.

The Edmund Rice (1638) Association, Inc. is governed by a Board of Directors, of at least five members, elected at the annual reunion and meeting, usually held on a weekend in September.

Descendants of Edmund Rice were holding reunions as early as 1851, but it was not until 1912 that the Association was formed and officers elected. Incorporation under Massachusetts law took place in 1934.

Membership is open to anyone who claims to be a lineal descendant of Edmund Rice. Rigorous proof is not required and many members have been able to ascertain their pedigree only after access to the books and files of other members. Spouses are also eligible for membership.

Obituary

CARROLL ALTON RICE

Carroll Alton Rice, Jr., Age 88, of Orangevale, CA passed away peacefully, March 26, 2021. He was affectionately called "Gohan", by his wife and close friends. He was born May 16, 1932, in Brattleboro, Vermont.

He joined the Air Force June 23, 1950, at the rank of Airman, specializing in radio communication, retiring as a Major on February 28, 1978. His first station was Itami Air Base where he met and married the love of his life, Yuriko. The Air Force took them to many places over the years: Lackland AFB TX, Johnson AB Japan, Scott AFB IL, 5 ATAF (NATO), Vicenza Italy, Keesler AFB MS, The Pentagon (residing in Alexandria VA), Langley AFB VA, Yokota AB Japan, retiring in Orangevale, CA. Carroll served in both Korea and Vietnam. He was very dedicated and distinguished himself as an outstanding officer receiving many medals and accolades for his service.

As a Communications Officer for Placer County in Auburn CA, he redesigned and modernized public safety and local government communications systems county wide as well as implementing the 911 Emergency Telephone System. Later, he worked for the County of Sacramento as an independent consultant on projects for the State of California Fish and Game Department and the California Highway Patrol.

His fondest memories were of living in Italy, Japan, and growing up in Vermont. He enjoyed playing the trumpet and building motorized model airplanes with his son. Carroll avidly researched and added to the family ancestry registry. He was an active licensed Radio Operator and a member of the American Legion Post 383 and VFW 6158 in Fair Oaks, CA. A charitable man who lived a life devoted to God, family, and country. Dad, you taught us well and we are forever grateful. We are your legacy.

Carroll is survived by his son Glenn Rice, daughters Michelle Jones and husband Keith, Jeanne Fitch and husband John, 6 grandchildren, 2 great grandsons, and his sister Nancy Powling. He was preceded in death by his parents, Carroll A. Rice, Sr., and Ethel Rice, brother, Paul, sister, Beverly, loving wife Yuriko Takata Rice, and grandson Brian Jones.

Continuing Series on Children of Edmund Rice: Lydia₂

Unlike most people, Edmund Rice had two surviving children with the same name: Lydia. The births of the two were separated by three decades, and so they did not overlap in Edmund's household, but they were indeed alive at the same time. The documentation of the second Lydia's family is rather thin, in part because of an unfortunate misunderstanding of the published vital records of Boston – the published yearly reports included not only the civil records of births, marriages, and deaths, but also the church records of baptisms, and some Rice researchers apparently confused the baptism lists with the death lists and thereby came to the conclusion that all of Lydia's children died young. Further research was thus presumably inhibited. Still, we have the beginnings of her progeny, and the presentation here may help to spur the long-deferred research.

Descendants of Lydia RICE

GENERATION 1

1. Lydia RICE [QQ121], born about 1657 at Sudbury, MA^{1 {1, 5}}, daughter of Deacon Edmund RICE and Mercy. She died 26 May 1718, (death year may be 1709). This second Lydia Rice is proven by the fact she was given land by her father on 10 May 1662, long after her half sister Lydia had married in 1645 to Hugh Drury.^{1 {p1}}

She married James HAWKINS Jr about 1678^{1 {1, 5}}. He was born about 1653, as calculated from his gravestone, died 6 Jan 1709/10, aged c56 at Boston, MA^{2,1 {p5}}, was buried 8 Jan 1709/10 at South Burial Ground, Boston, MA2, son of James HAWKINS and Mary MILLS.

Children of Lydia RICE and James HAWKINS Jr:

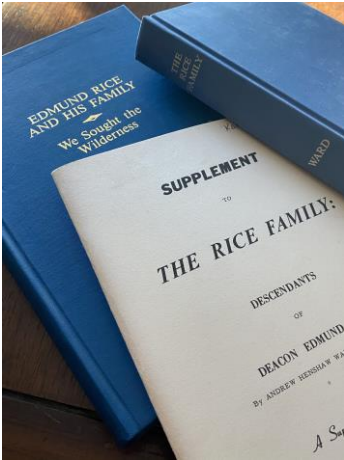
- i James HAWKINS [QQ1301], born 22 Jan 1679 at Boston, MA^{3,1 {p5}}.
- ii Lydia HAWKINS [QQ1302], born 24 Aug 1681 at Boston^{3,1 {p5}}. Is this the Lydia who married Samuel Adams at Boston in 1702?
- iii James HAWKINS [QQ1303], born 8 Aug 1683 at Boston^{3,1 {p5}}.
- iv Mercy HAWKINS [QQ1304], born 29 Oct 1687 at Boston^{3,1 {p5}}. She died young.
- v Abigail HAWKINS [QQ1305], born 13 Oct 1689 at Boston^{3,1 {p5}}.
- vi Mercy HAWKINS [QQ1306], born 20 Jul 1691 at Boston^{3,1 {p5}}. She died young.
- vii Mary HAWKINS [QQ1307], born 17 May 1693 at Boston^{3,1 {p5}}.
- viii Mercy HAWKINS [QQ1308], baptized 20 Sep 1696, (incorrectly listed as a death by the Rice Gen'l Register) at 1st Church, Boston, MA^{3,1 {p5}}.
- ix Abigail HAWKINS [QQ1309], baptized 26 Feb 1699, (incorrectly listed as a birth by the Rice Gen'l Register) at 1st Church^{3,1 {p5}}. Your authors note that Abigail's baptism entry fails to list her mother's name, thus leaving the identity of her father also open to question. Is this the Abigail who filed intention to marry Nathaniel Fedre in 1733?

Edmund Rice and His Family, by Elsie Hawes Smith (1938) A historical narrative about the early days of the Rices. Contains much genealogical information, as well as being a charming story.

We Sought the Wilderness, by Rev. Clayton Rice (1949) A historical narrative based on those Rices who pushed Westward to the prairies after short stays in New Hampshire and Vermont. 357 pages.

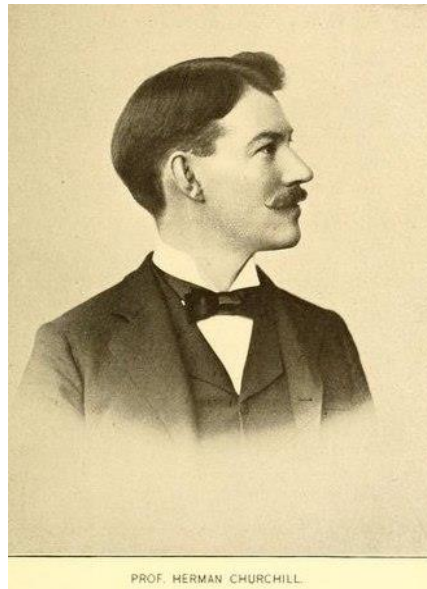
