President's Column



Greetings, cousins!

If you take a peek at the birthday wishes inside this issue, you will see my name appearing in the July section. Having recently reached the age of 73 (which seems not nearly so old to me now as it did when I was 37), my thoughts have turned to matters of age. Looking back at the very first presidential column that I wrote, I see that, even then, I was thinking of myself as especially young for being ERA president. I quote:

"As the new president of this association, I have the example before me of many dedicated predecessors, but I am such a "youngster" that I have known personally only four of them. It was not so very long ago, in fact, that I was awarded the prize as the youngest person in attendance at one of our annual meetings."

By the way, speaking of reunion door prizes, we also give one for the oldest member in attendance. According to an anonymized list, our oldest current member is, or will soon be, 101!

Fitting deeds to words, I have just completed a survey of ERA members past and present for whom we have the relevant data, and here is what I found. The average age of current members is 73, just the same as mine! On the other hand, it turns out that I am a real "old-timer" in terms of years of membership, since I have been in the Association for 29 years, compared to the average of 16 years for the membership at large.

That leads us to a related matter, namely the age of members when they first joined the ERA. From what I've already said, you could subtract 16 from 73 and conclude that the current members were 57 on average when they first joined. Actually, I rounded off those numbers, and so the average age at joining is closer to 58, but you get the idea. The point, as "everyone" says, is that many people don't have time to pursue a hobby like genealogy until they retire, and that tendency is reflected in this age statistic. In fact, it's a little surprising that the average is so "young," since a new-minted genealogist may be expected to take some time to trace as far back as Edmund Rice. Maybe people are retiring earlier these days. Then again, the person who inspired me to take up genealogy was my great uncle, who got started in the prime of his life and kept at it until the end.

In any case, as I indicated before, I also considered former members who have "left the fold" for one reason or another. It was not easy to figure out how long they had been members, but I was able to establish their ages when they joined. Lumping them together with the current members, I found an average age of 60, only a little older than the current average.

I hope to see you at the Wayside Inn September 20-21!


