President's Column



Greetings, Cousins!

I've been musing about information overload. In my previous column, I pointed out that some privacy can be maintained in effect, in spite of public availability of information, due to the sheer volume of such information. That analysis was from the point of view of an individual, but the concept of overload also applies to the ERA as a whole. It's not just that we are engaged in a quest to fill up a family database with somewhere on the order of 10 million people. At present, very many of the persons in our database have little information attached, sometimes only a forename (or only a surname) and links to spouse and maybe children. Ideally, we want to have a lot more. As I sometimes point out, our family database must not grow TOO rapidly, lest it outstrip the capacity of our computers.

In principle, it would be great if Edmund Rice (for example) had been on-line as a member of Ye Olde Face Booke. Think of all the "color" from his daily reporting of his activities in

farming, surveying, magistracy, and politics. And yet... If we had such material on down the years to the present day, how would we ever make sense of it all? This may be an unthinkably far-out scenario, but I'm already seeing hints of excess.

For example, FamilySearch has on-line (and indexed) a large set of military rosters from the time of World War I and shortly after. Each unit filed a monthly report showing all personnel with name and rank (but no other identifying information). In principle, we could follow an ancestor from enlistment to discharge to within a month, but what if his name was Frank Jones, or what if we didn't know for sure whether he actually served in the military? Checking the index for records pertaining to any male born c1900 with a common name would return a host of hits that might or might not be relevant and would necessarily complicate the task of sifting out the relevant non-military records. Note that, in the US, the Veterans Administration kept (and probably still keeps) a master index of all service personnel showing various serial numbers and dates of birth (and sometimes death), as well as enlistment and discharge, along with the unit(s) and ending rank.

Take another example, land records. Again, in principle, deeds of purchase or sale can be very important clues to date the arrival or departure from a city or town, provided that they pertain to the primary dwelling site. However, people also buy and sell wood lots, pastures, and rental or business properties, among others, without necessarily ever residing in the municipality in question. Furthermore, land records also include tax assessments and annual (or even quarterly) bills. If these are all indexed, and especially if separate tax bills are sent out for separate properties of a given owner, then the number of index entries for a common name can be staggering and, worse, possibly irrelevant. But the quest goes on.

Obituary



Rufina Delizo Rice (1954 – 2025)

South Kingstown, RI - Rufina Delizo Rice, "Ping" to her friends, beloved wife of Michael A. Rice, Ph.D. and mother of Maria Isabel Rice, Esq. passed away at Scallop Shell Nursing home in Peace Dale on the afternoon of January 10 after a sudden severe illness.

One of six siblings, Ping was born on March 26, 1954 in Baguio City in the Philippines to Laureano Cachero Delizo and Dolores Delizo de Delizo of Naguilian, La Union, Philippines and she attended local public elementary and high school in Baguio. Ping attended the University of Baguio earning a bachelor's degree in history in April 1976.

After a brief stint in the employ of the Philippine National Grain Authority, Ping joined the language staff of the U.S. Peace Corps in the Philippines in 1978 as an instructor of the Ilocano and Tagalog languages.

Ping and Mike met in September, 1981 at Caba, La Union during Mike's Peace Corps pre-service training. They were wed on January 8, 1983 at St. Vincent Ferrer Church in Baguio.

Ping first immigrated to the United States in January 1984. After Mike's Peace Corps end of service in January 1985, Ping was hired as a photographic technician at the Electron Microscope Facility at the University of California Irvine, where she developed photographic plates and prepared specimens for both transmission and scanning electron microscopy. The Rice family arrived in Rhode Island in October 1987 when Mike joined the faculty at the University of Rhode Island.

For nearly two decades, Ping became the daycare provider for the children of families connected with the university and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Laboratory in Narragansett. Decades later, "Auntie Ping" is still remembered fondly by her former charges, who have all gone on to do wonderful things.

Ping loved photography and was an avid gardener maintaining both outdoor flower gardens and tropical indoor plants. She was known as a talented cook with delicious surprises at every get-together.

Ping is survived by her spouse and daughter, as well as her siblings Henry Delizo of Lexington Park, Maryland, Delfin Delizo of Brisbane, Australia, and Caroline Delizo of Baguio City.

She is pre-deceased by her parents and three siblings, Marjorie Delizo of Baguio City, Luz Delizo Barber of Houston, Texas, and Nestor Delizo of Chicago.



Edmund Rice's Descendants

Continuing Series on the Children of Edmund Rice: Another Lydia

John F. Chandler

After a lapse of several years, we are again publishing an article focused on the immediate descendants of Edmund's children. Unlike all previous articles in this series, this one stops cold after the third generation. Part of the problem is that the *Genealogical Register of Edmund Rice Descendants* mistakenly shows the baptisms of Lydia's children as deaths, conveying the impression that her family probably died out entirely. There is every reason to expect that some of these children grew up and had children of their own, but we have no solid evidence. Let this article spur the interest of modern-day descendants to research the lineages and fill this gap in the ERA family database.

There are now only three of Edmund's children not yet covered in this series: Mary, Daniel, and Ruth. Mary presents a special case because of uncertainty over her identity (see an article about her in the Winter 2016 newsletter); Daniel died in infancy; Ruth will be the last of the series until and unless Mary's uncertainty can be resolved.

Descendants of Lydia RICE

1. Lydia RICE [QQ121], born about 1657 at Sudbury, MA, daughter of Deacon Edmund RICE and Mercy. She died 26 May 1718, (death year may be 1709). This second Lydia Rice is proven by the fact she was given land by her father on 10 May 1662, long after her half sister Lydia had married in 1645 to Hugh Drury.

She married James HAWKINS Jr about 1678. He was born about 1653, as calculated from his gravestone, died 6 Jan 1709/10, aged about 56 at Boston, MA, was buried 8 Jan 1709/10 at South Burial Ground, Boston, MA, son of James HAWKINS and Mary MILLS.

Children of Lydia RICE and James HAWKINS Jr:

- i James HAWKINS [QQ1301], born 22 Jan 1679 at Boston, MA.
- ii Lydia HAWKINS [QQ1302], born 24 Aug 1681 at Boston. Is this the Lydia who married Samuel Adams at Boston in 1702?
 - iii James HAWKINS [QQ1303], born 8 Aug 1683 at Boston.
 - iv Mercy HAWKINS [QQ1304], born 29 Oct 1687 at Boston. She died young.
 - v Abigail HAWKINS [QQ1305], born 13 Oct 1689 at Boston.
 - vi Mercy HAWKINS [QQ1306], born 20 Jul 1691 at Boston. She died young.
 - vii Mary HAWKINS [QQ1307], born 17 May 1693 at Boston.
- viii Mercy HAWKINS [QQ1308], baptized 20 Sep 1696, (incorrectly listed as a death by the *Rice Gen'l Register*) at 1st Church, Boston, MA.
- ix Abigail HAWKINS [QQ1309], baptized 26 Feb 1699, (incorrectly listed as a birth by the *Rice Gen'l Register*) at 1st Church. Your authors note that Abigail's baptism entry fails to list her mother's name, thus leaving the identity of her father also open to question. Is this the Abigail who filed intention to marry Nathaniel Fedre in 1733?
